GENERAL

Samford University is a private, coed, four-year institution. 180-acre, suburban campus in Birmingham (population: 265,968); study center abroad in London, England. Served by air, bus, and train. 4-1-4 system.

LD ADMISSIONS

Students do not complete a separate application and are not simultaneously accepted to the LD program. A member of the LD program does not sit on the admissions committee. A personal interview is recommended. Essay is required and may be typed.

SECONDARY SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

Graduation from secondary school required; GED accepted. The following course distribution required: 4 units of English, 3 units of math, 3 units of science, 2 units of social studies, 2 units of history.

53% are from out of state. 29% join a fraternity and 34% join a sorority. Average age of full-time undergraduates is 21. 58% of classes have fewer than 20 students, 40% have between 20 and 50 students, 2% have more than 50 students.

STUDENT HOUSING

93% of freshmen live in college housing. Freshmen are required to live on campus. Housing is not guaranteed for all undergraduates. Housing is provided only to single unmarried undergraduates. Campus can house 1,860 undergraduates. Single rooms are available for students with medical or special needs. A medical note is required.
