GENERAL

New York University is a private, coed, four-year institution. Urban campus in New York City (population: 8,175,133). Served by air, bus, and train. School operates transportation to residence halls, campus facilities, and sports/entertainment complex. Public transportation serves campus. Semester system.

LD ADMISSIONS

Application deadline: January 1. A member of the LD program does not sit on the admissions committee. Secondary school waivers are accepted for mathematics and foreign language. Personal interview is not required. Essay is required and may be typed.

SECONDARY SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

Graduation from secondary school required; GED accepted. The following course distribution required: 4 units of English, 3 units of mathematics, 3 units of science, 2 units of foreign language, 4 units of history.

TESTING

SAT Reasoning or ACT required. SAT Subject required of some applicants. Admissions test requirements for LD students same as for other students. All enrolled freshmen (fall 2011):

65% are from out of state. 2% join a fraternity and 1% join a sorority. Average age of full-time undergraduates is 21. 63% of classes have fewer than 20 students, 27% have between 20 and 50 students, 10% have more than 50 students.

STUDENT HOUSING

88% of freshmen live in college housing. Housing is available to unmarried students regardless of year; campus can house 10,310 undergraduates. Single rooms are available for students with medical or special needs; a medical note is required.

EXPENSES

Tuition (2012-13): \$40,878 per year (College of Arts and Sciences), \$41,358 (Stern School of Business), \$45,106 (Tisch School of the Arts). Room: \$10,876. Board: \$4,306. There is no additional cost for LD program/services.
